PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING BEFORE SIGNING THE APPLICATION PERMIT.

Each applicant is responsible for compliance with the terms and conditions of the current New Mexico Department of Game and Fish Easement. Applicant understands that the approval of this application and issuance of any Use Agreement is subject to the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Lands. Applicant understands that any permit issued on this application will include the following conditions, requirements and restrictions, among others:

1. Permit will be effective for no more than one license year (April 1 through March 31) and may be canceled by the Commissioner of Public Lands at any time the Commissioner believes such cancellation will be in the best interest of state trust land or beneficiary institutions.
2. The permit will allow entry to only certain types of state trust land, certain listed Management Units and DOES NOT authorize entry onto or across federal or private lands, not even to gain entry to state trust land. The applicant will be responsible for accurately identifying and locating permit lands to which entry is permitted by each Use Agreement. Permittee is responsible for identifying state trust lands subject to the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish easement including closures and unitizations. Corner crossing without written permission of the landowner or lessee is considered trespass and is prohibited. This prohibition will be enforced at the discretion of the Department of Game and Fish or local district attorney.
3. In issuing any permit the state does not represent that state trust land is free from dangerous or hazardous conditions. Permittee will enter state trust land at Permittee's own risk. Permittee shall indemnify the state for all liability resulting from damages suffered by anyone as a consequence of Permittee's presence on state trust land, the presence on state trust land of any licensees served by Permittee, or by the presence of hazardous materials or conditions on state trust land.
4. Permittee will be required to protect state trust land from environmental degradation and to restore all campsites. All trash must be hauled out of state trust land, not buried or burned. Pit toilets must be dug if a campsite is to be occupied for forty-eight hours or longer. Permittee may not cut standing trees, even if such trees are dead. Permittee must comply with any and all fire restrictions, including those covered 19.20.3 NMAC (Restrictions for Fire Prevention) and NMSA 30-17-1 (Improper Handling of Fire). Contact the N.M. State Forestry Division at (505) 827-5830 for current conditions. Vehicles are not allowed to leave established roads. Ruins, monuments, structures or objects found on state trust land may not be altered or damaged in any way or removed from state trust land.
5. Efforts on state trust land are ongoing to reduce forest fuels and risk of high severity fires, while improving ecosystem function and health. Permittee is allowed to bring in fire wood for campfires; however, Permittee must follow all fire restrictions in place on public lands. For inquiries on restrictions contact the New Mexico State Land Office.
6. Permittee will be required to accommodate and avoid interference with the activities of other authorized users of the same state trust land. Permittee understands that Commissioner has sole discretion whether to approve use of any campsite (even if Permittee provides written approval from SLO's grazing lessee). Permittee must be prepared to make the permit or permit card immediately available for inspection by other authorized users of state trust lands, law enforcement officials (including Department of Game and Fish staff), or State Land Office personnel. Permittee is not allowed to access buildings, crops or other improvements on the

state trust land and are required to close all gates they open under penalty of law. Permittee is not allowed to graze animals on state trust land.
